Jeanne described many of the details captured in previous minutes in that it's going to be more social/mingling vs formal dinner. Volunteers are welcome to attend the next Committee meeting to get some service hours. As described in previous meetings, the Spring Fling will be Kentucky Derby themed! We are still looking for Kentucky Derby themed games/contests. Volunteer sheets are also on the website if you chose to not attend or meet \$200 financial obligation. Parents can elect to work the event in lieu of the \$200 minimum financial obligation. We are fundraising for renovations on 2nd floor, middle school hallway, we want to make gymnasium upgrades (sound absorbers, water fountain/bottle filler). We also want to invest in hands-on enrichment learning curriculums. We are counting on Spring Fling to be successful so that we can fund these improvements.

XIV. Financial Report (Heather DeJarlais)

We are doing ok with money for this point in the year. We promised teachers we would fund field trips. Proposed 7th grade Holocaust Museum, 8th Shakespeare, 6th, 5th bus. \$650 per bus. Parents will still fund most of field trip (tickets to venues) Goal is we will cover the bus in future trips. Motion made and passed unanimously for HSA to fund bus transportation.

XV. Proposed Spending/Voting

- New Drama Enrichment Class (Katie described a contact of hers from a previous school who taught grade school and theater in NWI. She would like to bring her into SJE to give students a drama enrichment option (and maybe a play for parents!). The candidate is very excited about the opportunity and meeting at the school tomorrow. This program wiuld start on January 22nd. We need money for a stipend like other programs.
- Safety Purchases (\$8,400 for Safety supply buckets and quick door-stoppers we did ask for them to be donated or to be provided at cost, this is the high end of the range estimate)

- Water RO System for Teachers' Lounge & MEC (\$1,800 to replace coolers with systems with RO drinking water system (\$900 per system))
- Heather proposed Whiteboards for \$100 for middle school math (YES)

XVI. Open Discussion

Ms Lowe: Moving into the fall, HSA should strongly consider going cashless. It would require anyone handling money to be Giftsmart trained (it's fairly easy online training). There's some learning involved to make it happen, but more convenient, 21^{st} century and easier to streamline all of our events and fundraiser. Each event has its own Giftsmart "campaign" with its own QR code, accounting and reporting. It's very user friendly. Spring Fling has already been in Giftsmart and should make it easy for other events because all the parents and most vendors and sponsors are in the system. Jeanne is going to find out if there are any limits on campaigns, etc.

Stephanie Bracken an additional request re the Daddy Daughter Dance – we are looking for a set of sporting event tickets (4) to include in a raffle basket.
