Preparing middle school students for high school is no easy task, given the scope of high school and college/career readiness expectations. As early as kindergarten, students begin learning technology basics in computer science class. They gradually learn typing skills, how to create documents and spreadsheets, computer programming, computer-aided design, robotics, 21st century citizenship (ethical technology use and online safety), and much more throughout elementary and middle school. Students at SJE have the advantage of a multiple operating systems curriculum that provides them with the opportunity to become proficient in both Apple (Macintosh) and PC (Windows).

This multi-platform, comprehensive Computer Science/STEM curriculum, gives students the tools to not only compete, but to excel in high school and beyond. While technology continues to evolve at an accelerated pace, SJE focuses on preparing students with the knowledge and capabilities to adapt to change.

How do you make learning fun?

Many of the students in preschool, kindergarten, and 1st grade are familiar with using tablets, but have little to no experience with desktop computers, keyboards, or a mouse. These basic tools of computing may be brand new to them, which creates interest and excitement. Mr. Purvines is pleased to work with the elementary school students because of their enthusiasm and enjoys challenging all of the K-8 students.

SJE has several pieces of educational software and hardware that are designed to stimulate student interest. For example, students pair OSMO devices with iPads and learn through play by merging tactile exploration with innovative technology. The students love learning math, reading, deductive reasoning, and the basics of coding through this platform.

What can students do to reinforce computer skills?

SJE offers a typing program, which is differentiated to meet the needs of all students. Students have the ability to sign onto the program from anywhere at (sjetyping.typingclub.com), so they can continue to practice outside of school. We also utilize resources such as sphero.edu, code.org, and codeacademy.com to teach computer programming, coding, and robotics.

What educational apps can students utilize outside of school to study?

In addition to resources already mentioned, there are a variety of other programs students can use at home to enhance their academic skills.

Math: The award-winning mathematics app, Dragonbox, allows students to learn and enhance math skills ranging from basic number recognition and computational thinking to algebra and geometry.

Reading: Libby, by OverDrive, gives users access to all of the Lake County library online content and resources.

Computer Science: *Secret Coders*, codeacademy.com and khanacademy.org help young learners understand the programming mindset.

PRESCHOOL

Preschool at SJE is always abuzz with various learning activities. Marytherese Polak and Melissa Schmidt teach the 3 & 4 year old preschool programs, assisted by aides Jil Carlson, Marie King and Marge Pagorek.



What types of hands-on learning do you utilize in preschool? Students engage in daily center work, which is designed to help them learn to work collaboratively in small group settings. This gives the preschoolers opportunities to practice specific academic skills, while also learning social skills, self-regulation, and time management. Examples of center activities include sound matching games, counting and sorting, number matchups using manipulatives, bingo games focusing on the alphabet, numbers, colors, and shapes, plus marble runs, gears, jumbo pegs, play-dough, etc.

We really enjoy creating interactive, hands-on activities for the preschoolers. Some of our favorite lessons include using puppets to teach various

skills, learning about life cycles through raising butterflies, gardening, etc.

Preschoolers develop a sense of responsibility and a number of social-emotional skills that help to prepare them for kindergarten and beyond.

Students are taught to clean up after play time, snack time, and all activities. As their language skills continue to develop, they become more comfortable and confident in verbalizing their needs. They learn when it is their turn to speak and when to listen and follow directions. They have many opportunities to interact with peers through activities and play which helps them learn how to appropriately express their feelings in a positive way, as well as learn how to share. The staff also reinforces ways to help students become more independent, including how to pack and unpack their belongings every day.

SJE's preschool teachers and aides help prepare students for a successful transition to kindergarten. Throughout the

year, students work on the lower/uppercase alphabet, number recognition, and writing their names independently.



A typical day at preschool spans a number of activities that provide students with independent playtime, structured activities and hands on learning. Students learn through engaging in table activities, prayer, show and tell, songs, story time, centers, free-choice time, group time, outdoor play, wow words, religion lessons, and a multitude of other age appropriate activities.



Mrs. Emerson and Mrs. Giegerich strive to ensure kindergarten students are "well-rounded" individuals who learn, live, and love as Jesus taught us. While math and reading are very important, they also want students to have great manners, treat others with kindness, be problem solvers, and have a variety of educational skills as they move into the "big" building for first grade. Kindergarteners love having the opportunity to experience specials classes, such as music, gym, library, computer science, and Spanish.

Kindergarteners have specials each week for about two and a half hours where they engage in fine arts activities, sports, technology, and begin learning a foreign language. Mrs. Emerson and Mrs. Giegerich collaborate with the specials teachers on a variety of lessons. For example, kindergarteners type their sight words in computer science, and the reading series has bilingual stories. It's a great way to reinforce the lessons kindergarteners are learning, and also learn the information using a different approach.

ROBOTICS



Now in its second year, SJE Robotics kicked off their competition season by earning a spot in the Finals at the Squared Away Competition on October 26th, placing 2nd and 3rd. At the Kingsford Heights Robotics Tournament, SJE's teams placed 2nd, 3rd and 4th in the Teamwork Blended Competition. The team also qualified for State in the Skills Competition. Students have been designing, building, and coding robots to compete in the Vex IQ Challenges. Students score points by using robots to pick up cubes and placing them on the corresponding platforms or corners of the field, and putting balls in or on the cubes.

SJE's Robotics program helps students develop critical thinking and problem solving skills as they create their robots. They practice using the engineering design process as they improve their robot, record their ideas, and work in engineering workbooks. The students strengthen their teamwork skills by collaborating with their teammates to design the best robot and by strategizing with other teams at tournaments to score the most points.

RESOURCES

with Mrs. Maruszczak

Students at SJE who need a little extra help with their studies are able to get the support they need thanks to Mrs. Maruszczak, SJE's Resource Teacher. On any given day, Mrs. Maruszczak will work with small reading groups, typically K-5 students, who need extra instruction and practice with reading. She administers tests to K-8th grade students and checks in with them on a regular basis, especially if she sees a falling grade or missing assignment. She helps students with organizational skills, reminds them to write down homework assignments and monitors their behavior plans. She provides targeted interventions to individual students on decoding, reading comprehension, writing, etc.

"Collaborating with teachers is key to staying on top of students' progress. I touch base with them regularly to find out how students are doing in the classroom and if they are having any particular struggles. I keep track of students' grades and reach out if I see grades dropping. We discuss additional supports that may be useful to the student within their classroom or with me. I also collaborate with teachers on behavior plans for specific students, determining how to curb negative behaviors, and providing incentives for positive behavior," says Mrs. Maruszczak.



Resources assist students in a number of ways, whether it's pushing into students' classes to give them extra support or bringing them to the Resource room to provide small group or one-on-one help. There are students who take both standardized state tests and classroom tests in Resource, so that they are able to receive appropriate accommodations. SJE's advanced math teacher, Mrs. Baly, also helps in Resource, leading all of the math groups.

How do SJE students benefit from having a Resource Teacher? According to Mrs. Maruszczak, "We often work on strategies students can use in the classroom, studying for a test or preparing a writing assignment. Becoming more organized and taking more initiative to become independent in their work/study habits is setting them up for future success."

SPANISH

with Mrs. Tapia-Morris

Students in grades K-8 attend Spanish class at SJE. "I like to use communicative and hands on skills. I encourage students to use the language to ask for basic necessities. Additionally, students learn to read bilingual books," says Mrs. Tapia-Morris. SJE adopted a new middle school Spanish curriculum titled ¡Avancemos! Mrs. Tapia-Morris believes the new curriculum has helped students become more comfortable with the targeted language. "Not only is it tech friendly, but it also has many fun and interactive features that help students with different learning styles understand the material."

HOME AND SCHOOL ASSOCIATION NEWS

Home and School Association (HSA) is the parent organization that supports the academic experiences of students at SJE. Due to the success of the Race for Education and Spring Fling fundraisers, HSA was able to provide the funding needed for several major purchases including the MS Spanish curriculum (\$4,281), Science curriculum (\$38,255), MS English books (\$8,460), Social Studies curriculum (\$26,152), tables and chairs (\$12,211) and art supplies (\$1,664).
