### **1. What is faith? (Chapter 1)**

Faith is a gift from God that enables us to believe in Him and all He has revealed.

### **2. What is a mystery? (Chapter 1)**

A mystery is something we believe through faith because God revealed it to us although we do not fully understand it.

There are three persons in one God.

### **4. What do we call the mystery of three persons in God? (Chapter 2)**

The Blessed Trinity.

### **5. Name the three Persons of the Blessed Trinity. (Chapter 2)**

1. God the Father (First Person)
2. God the Son (Second Person)
3. God the Holy Spirit (Third Person)

### **6. Who is God? (Chapter 2)**

God is the all-powerful, all-wise, all-loving being who created everything and keeps it in existence.

### **7. How did God create the world and everything in it? (Chapter 3)**

God created the world and everything in it out of nothing.

### **8. What are Angels? (Chapter 4)**

Angels are servants and messengers of God. They are purely spiritual beings having no body.

**9. What is your soul? (Chapter 5)**

The spiritual and eternal gift from God that gives us life.

**10. What are the two main powers of our souls and what do we do with each of them? (Chapter 5)**

1. A mind - so that we can think.
2. A Will - so that we can choose.

**11. Who were the first people that God created? (Chapter 5)**

Adam was the first man and Eve was the first woman.

**12. What is Grace? (Chapter 5)**

Grace is God's life in us.

God made you in His image and likeness.

A miracle is a supernatural sign or wonder, brought about by God, signifying His glory and the salvation of mankind.

**26. What are the two natures of Jesus Christ? (Chapter 17)**

Jesus is True God and True Man. He is one person with two natures (Divine and Human).

**27. What do we call the union of Jesus' two natures? (Chapter 17)**

The Hypostatic Union

**28. What do we mean by the terms "Persons" & "Nature"? (Chapter 17)**

- Nature is **WHAT** someone is. (God)
- Person is **WHO** someone is. (God the Father; God the Son; God the Holy Spirit)

**29. On Holy Thursday, what was Jesus celebrating with His Apostles at the Last Supper? (Chapter 19)**

Jesus was celebrating the Passover Meal. This was the first Mass; the institution of the Holy Eucharist.

**30. What 2 Sacraments did Jesus institute at The Last Supper? (Chapter 19)**

1. Eucharist (Holy Communion)
2. Holy Orders (Priesthood)

**31. What is represented at Mass? (Chapter 20)**

The passion, death and resurrection is represented at the Mass. (Jesus does not suffer again; **we are brought** to Calvary for the once, and only Holy Sacrifice.

**32. What is the Resurrection? (Chapter 21)**

Jesus rose from the Dead on Easter Sunday three days after He died on the cross.

**33. What happened on the evening of the Resurrection - Easter Sunday? (Chapter 21)**

Jesus appeared to His Apostles and instituted the Sacrament of Confession when He breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit whose sins you shall forgive they are forgiven; whose sins you shall hold bound they are held bound."

**34. What is the Great Commission?(Chapter 22)**

Before He rose into Heaven Jesus commanded His Apostles, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the son and of the Holy Spirit..

Mt. 28:18-20

**35. What is the Ascension? (Chapter 22)**

Jesus rose in the sky to return to the Father 40 days after Easter.

**53. What is infallibility? (Chapter 27)**

Infallibility is the ability to teach without error on matters of **Faith & Morals**. This can be done by either:

- The Pope alone or
- The Bishops in union with the Pope

Original sin is the first sin committed by Adam and Eve. We are born with it; we inherit it from them.

**60. What are two types of Actual Sin? (Chapter 28)**

1. Mortal
2. Venial

**61. What is Mortal sin? (Chapter 28)**

A mortal sin is a very serious sin. It completely breaks our relationship with God.

**62. What three things are necessary for a sin to be mortal? (Chapter 28)**

1. It must be seriously wrong.
2. We must know that it is seriously wrong.
3. We must freely choose to do it.

**63. What is a Venial sin? (Chapter 28)**

A venial sin is a less serious sin. It damages our relationship with God.

**64. What are the two other names for the Sacrament of Confession? (Chapter 28)**

- Penance
- Reconciliation

**65. What are the 6 steps to making a worthy confession?  
(Chapter 28)**

1. Make an examination of conscience before you go.
2. **Make** the Sign of the Cross.
3. **Say** "Bless me Father for I have sinned it has been \_\_\_\_\_ since my last Confession."
4. **Say** your sins and then say, "For these and all my sins I am truly sorry."
5. **Say** an Act of Contrition and **accept** your penance.
6. **Receive** absolution and do your penance.

**66. What was the Assumption of the Blessed Mother?

Mary was taken up to heaven body & soul at the end of her earthly life.

Death is the moment when the soul separates from the body.

The General Judgment will be the final judgment by Christ passed publicly on all people at the end of the world when our bodies will be reunited with our souls and our final destination will be announced.

Hell is a place of eternal separation from God (where there is no love of God, no love of others and no love of self).

Purgatory is a place of temporary separation from God, where a person is made able to go to heaven.

Heaven is eternal happiness with God.

The human person, created in the image of God, is a being at once corporeal (physical) and spiritual. (CCC 362)

### **The Apostles Creed**

- 6<sup>th</sup> Station: Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.
- 7<sup>th</sup> Station: Jesus falls the second time.
- 8<sup>th</sup> Station: Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
- 9<sup>th</sup> Station: Jesus falls a third time.
- 10<sup>th</sup> Station: Jesus' clothes are taken away.
- 11<sup>th</sup> Station: Jesus is nailed to the cross.
- 12<sup>th</sup> Station: Jesus dies on the cross.
- 13<sup>th</sup> Station: The body of Jesus is taken down from the cross.
- 14<sup>th</sup> Station: Jesus is laid in the tomb.

### **Act of Faith (short version)**

### **Act of Hope (short version)**

O my God, I love you above all things, because You are infinitely good, and for Your sake I love my neighbor as myself.
