1. **What is Divine Revelation?**

Divine Revelation is God's communication about himself and his plan for humanity.

2. **What are the two fonts of Divine Revelation?**

1. Sacred Scripture
2. Sacred Tradition

3. **What is the central Christian belief that there is one God in three Divine Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit?**

The Holy Trinity

4. **What is Sacred Tradition?**

Sacred Tradition is both the content of the Catholic Faith and the way that content has been handed down through the centuries under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

5. **What is Faith?**

Faith is the theological virtue by which we believe in God and believe all that He has said and revealed to us, because He is truth itself. (CCC 1814)

6. **What is monotheism?**

Monotheism is the belief in one God.

7. **How did God fully reveal Himself?**

God fully revealed Himself by sending his Son, Jesus Christ.

Jesus is God, so God the Father FULLY revealed himself by sending his son Jesus.

8. **Who is responsible for authentically interpreting and teaching on Scripture and Tradition?**

The Bishops, as the successors of the Apostles, and the Pope as Successor of the first Pope, Peter.

9. **What faith was practiced by Jesus and is the root of our Christian faith?**

The Jewish faith

13. What is the Ascension?

The Ascension is the event that occurred forty days after the Resurrection, when Jesus was taken up to Heaven.

14. What are the names of the four Gospels and what do they tell us about?

The four Gospels are Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

They tell about the life, teachings, Passion (suffering), death, Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus Christ.

15. In the Gospel of John, whom does Jesus refer to as the Holy Spirit?

The Advocate

16. What does the word "Gospel" mean?

The word "Gospel" means "Good News".

17. When did Sacred Tradition begin?

Sacred Tradition began with the preaching of the Apostles.

18. What is a soul?

A soul is a spiritual gift from God given to us at conception and makes us human.

The soul survives after death (immortal).

19. What is the Paschal Mystery?

The Paschal Mystery is the belief of how Jesus' Passion, death, Resurrection and Ascension saves us from sin and death.

20. What is a prophet?

A prophet is a person whom God calls to speak on His behalf.

Many of the Old Testament prophets were called to turn God's people away from sin and prepare for the coming of Christ.

21. Who was the final prophet of the Old Covenant?

John the Baptist

22. What do Catholics stand and say during Sunday Mass to express their belief in one Trinitarian God?

The Apostles' Creed or the Nicene Creed

23. What do we call a special promise given by God?

A covenant

24. What does the word Messiah mean?

Anointed one

25. What is the mystery of Jesus Christ being both fully God and fully man?

Incarnation

26. What level of teaching authority does an Ecumenical Council have?

Ecumenical Councils authoritatively teach the Catholic Faith infallibly, meaning without error. Catholics are required to assent to these infallible teachings.

27. What is the Immaculate Conception?

From the moment Mary came into being (her conception), she was immaculate – without Original Sin

28. What Ecumenical Council met in the early 1500's to respond to Martin Luther's ideas and the issues of the Protestant Reformation?

The Council of Trent

29. What is salvation history?

The pattern of events in human history through which God makes his presence and his saving actions known to us.

Hypostatic Union

64. List 6 facts about St. Pio of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio).

1. Born in southern Italy in 1887.
2. At age 5, he had already dedicated his life to God but had many illnesses.
3. He began seeing visions as a child and wanted to join a religious order but he wasn't educated.
4. His father left the family and moved to the USA to get a job so he could pay for his son's education, he was admitted into a Francian community known as the Order of Friars Minor (OFM) at 16.
5. At age 17, he became very ill and at the same time his peers began to report strange things about Pio going into trances and actually floating off the ground while he was in prayer.
6. During WWI American soldiers would visit and they witnessed the stigmata and experienced his ability to tell others their sins.
7. Padre Pio was canonized in 2002.
8. His feast day is September 23 and is patron of adolescents.

- 6th Station: Veronica wipes the face of Jesus.
- 7th Station: Jesus falls the second time.
- 8th Station: Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
- 9th Station: Jesus falls a third time.
- 10th Station: Jesus' clothes are taken away.
- 11th Station: Jesus is nailed to the cross.
- 12th Station: Jesus dies on the cross.
- 13th Station: The body of Jesus is taken down from the cross.
- 14th Station: Jesus is laid in the tomb.

Act of Faith (short version)
